Open Letter (نامهٔ سر گشاده انگلیسی)

This letter is addressed to the freedom and peace -loving people who are against any violence to people. With the demand, to join us in our fight against the exercise of the violence against women in Afghanistan, to show solidarity for the prosecution of criminal elements and for the support of victims of violence.

The following incident has led us to make urgent attention to the circumstances in Afghanistan. In the city of Herat in northwestern Afghanistan on Friday night 12/13/2013 about 1.00 clock local time a drug-addicted man his young wife (Satara , 23 years old and the mother of four daughters) mangled in a cruel manner. He has his wife's nose and lips cut off , after he had beaten unconscious with a stone hit on the head . Occasion was because they had refused to give him money for his drugs. The mother of Setare required by human rights organizations of the matter thoroughly investigate . Maleka Rasuli , the person in charge of women's rights in the Human Rights Commission in Herat , says that as long as criminals must expect serious consequences after such a cruel fact, the situation will not change . A week ago, two women had hanged himself in despair because they could not endure the violence of men against him.

These are unfortunately not isolated cases . Afghanistan is the country with the highest rate of violence against women. The Commission on Human Rights in Afghanistan has announced that the violence against women in Afghanistan has increased by 25 % in the first half of 2013 . Of course, this is the officially - registered number : The number of unreported cases is much higher .

Hamed Karzai, President of Afghanistan, has called the law on violence against women in certain cases as a criminal offense four years ago. But the Afghan Human Rights Commission can consider that the law is enforced very hesitant.

Let us not consider these criminal acts as a natural and normal.

Let a few against all inhumane acts and violations of human rights everywhere, including in Afghanistan.

Let's express our solidarity with all victims of violence in the world and stand up for their rights.

Long live the human dignity, human rights and justice.

We call on the Human Rights Commissions here in Germany and in Strasbourg with such crimes that are against human rights and human dignity to deal up, and put pressure on the Afghan government and pressure on competent human rights commissions on site to ensure that such incidents do not happen again .
